Leaving the State for a while? What you need to know about the U.S. 2020 Census:

Do you live or sleep at more than one address? Are you a "snowbird" who seasonally lives at another address? If yes, did you know that your information should be counted at the address where you live and sleep the most?

- If you live in Massachusetts for most of the year, you need to fill out the census form for your Massachusetts address.
- The U.S. Census data is for statistical purposes only.
- Your responses on the U.S. Census will not affect your property tax or insurance premiums.
- You will be able to fill out the U.S. Census online, over the phone, or the traditional paper form.
- This information is used for data for the next 10 years, money for state and federal programs, and your political representation.
- This information is <u>strictly confidential</u> and will not be shared with any federal or state agency under Title 13 of the U.S. Code.

Holiday Eggnog

2 cups milk 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon, plus more for garnish 1/2 tsp. around nutmea 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract 6 large egg yolks

1/2 cup granulated sugar 1 cup heavy cream 1/3 cup bourbon or rum (optional) whipping cream, for serving



1.) In a small saucepan over low heat, combine milk, cinnamon, nutmeg, and vanilla and slowly bring mixture to a low boil.

2.) Meanwhile, in a large bowl, whisk egg yolks with sugar until yolks are pale in color. Slowly add hot milk mixture to egg yolks in batches to temper the eggs and whisk until combined.

3.) Return mixture to saucepan and cook over medium heat until slightly thick (and coats the back of a spoon) but does not boil. (if using a candy thermometer, mixture should reach 160°F.)

4.) Remove from heat and stir in heavy cream and, if using, booze.

5.) Refrigerate until chilled.

6.) When ready to serve, garnish with whipped cream ad cinnamon.

Living with Psoriatic Arthritis

Psoriatic arthritis is a form of arthritis that affects some people who have psoriasis - a condition that features red patches of skin topped with silvery scales. Most people develop psoriasis first and are later diagnosed with psoriatic arthritis, but the joint your doctor if you develop joint pain. Psoriatic arthritis can problems can sometimes begin before skin patches appear.

Joint pain, stiffness and swelling are the main signs and symptoms of psoriatic arthritis. They can affect any part of your body, including your fingertips and spine, and can range from relatively mild to severe. In both psoriasis and psoriatic arthritis, disease flares may alternate with periods of remission.

No cure for psoriatic arthritis exists, so the focus is on controlling symptoms and preventing damage to your joints. With out treatment, psoriatic arthritis may be disabling.

Some symptoms are:


- Swollen Fingers and Toes: psoriatic arthritis can cause a painful, sausage-like swelling of your fingers and toes. You may also develop swelling and deformities in your hands and feet before having significant joint symptoms.
- Foot Pain: psoriatic arthritis can also cause pain at the points where tendons and ligaments attach to your bones especially at the back of your heel (Achilles Tendinitis) or in the sole of your foot (Planter Fasciitis).
- Lower Back Pain: some people develop a condition called spondylitis as a result of psoriatic arthritis. Spondylitis mainly causes inflammation of the joints between the vertebrae of your spine and in the joints between your spine and pelvis (sacroiliitis)

When to see a doctor: If you have psoriasis, be sure to tell severely damage your joints if left intreated.

Causes: Psoriatic arthritis occurs when your body's immune system begins to attack healthy cells and tissue. The abnormal immune response causes inflammation in your joints as well as overproduction of skin cells. It's not entirely clear why the immune system attacks healthy tissue, but it seems likely that both genetic and environmental factors play a role. Many people with psoriatic arthritis have a family history of either psoriasis. Researchers have discovered certain genetic markers that appear to be associated with psoriatic arthritis.


