Cheesy Chicken Alfredo Soup

2 tbsp. butter 1 lb. chicken breast Kosher salt Freshly ground black pepper 1 large onion, diced 3 cloves garlic, minced

1/4 c. all-purpose flour 4 c. low-sodium chicken broth 1 c. half and half 9 oz. tortellini 2 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes Fresh basil, for garnish



1.) In a large pot over medium-high heat, melt butter. Cook chicken until cooked through and golden, 6 minutes per side, then season with salt and pepper and set aside. Once cool, dice.

2.) Add onion to pot and cook until soft and golden, 6 minutes, then add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute. Add flour and whisk until golden, 2 to 3 minutes, then add chicken broth and half and half and simmer until thickened, 15 minutes.

3.) Add tortellini to pot and cook until al dente, 10 minutes. Add diced chicken and season with crushed red pepper flakes, salt, and pepper.

4.) Ladle into bowls and garnish with basil.

Boxford Burning Permits—2020

Burning permits are now on sale. The burning season is January 15th thru May 1st. Permits can be purchased online or at the East Fire Station — the cost is \$20.00. Rules and regulations for the 2020 season are as follows:

Burning is allowed only on the property designated on the 1. permit.

All permits must be activated between 10AM and 12PM (noon) prior to burning. To activate your permit:

- A. Call the Communication Department (978-887-8137). OR
- B. Activate online by clicking on "\$PAY ONLINE" which is located on the Town's website just below the "Town of Boxford" header. From there — on "Select Bill Type" click on "Activate Burn."

Participant's are prohibited from burning before 10AM. All fires must be started between 10AM and 12 Noon.

- Fires must be extinguished by 4PM. Burning after 4PM is 4. prohibited.
- 5. Participants shall completely extinguish their fires, which include pulling the pile apart and extinguishing the coals.
- Participants must make available a water supply such as a 6. pressurized water pump can, a garden hose, and shovels or rakes nearby for controlling the fire.
- 7. Fires must be at least 75 ft. from any structure including sheds.
- Fires must be attended at all times. 8.
- 9. Participants may burn brush, cane, driftwood and forestry debris.
- 10. At no time are you allowed to burn grass, hay, leaves, stumps, construction materials, trash or other related items.
- 11. In case of high winds or otherwise dangerous conditions, this permit is invalid as provided by law.

Feeling Sleepy All the Time?

It can be miserable to feel too sleepy. If you have trouble staying awake during the day, you may wonder "Why do I feel sleepy all the time?" Discover some of the common symptoms of excessive <u>sleepiness</u> and potential health consequences, and then dive into seven reasons that sleep disorders may lead to feeling sleepy all the time.

Red Flags for Sleep Disorders:

- Taking more than 20 to 30 minutes to fall asleep initially or to get back to sleep after waking.
- Light fragmented sleep with frequent awakenings that does not feel refreshing.
- Disturbed breathing during sleep including snoring, gasping, chocking, and witnessed pauses.
- Other symptoms of sleep apnea such as frequent urination at night, bruxism (teeth grinding), morning headaches, heart palpitations, and heartburn at night.
- Narcolepsy: the least specific being excessive sleepiness. This sleep disorder occurs when there is a problem with the regulation of sleep and wakefulness. Characteristics of sleep may suddenly occur while awake (such as paralysis) and elements of wakefulness may intrude upon sleep.
- Chronic Fatigue Syndrome is a condition that might make you feel tired, exhausted, or sleepy. It is characterized by worsened fatigue that occurs after exertion. It is also associated with less refreshing sleep and frequent joint and

muscle spasm.

 Restless legs syndrome is characterized by an uncomfortable sensation in the legs associated with an urge to move. It often develops in the evening as you are lying down to rest and is relieved by movement.

Medicare Savings Programs

A new state law in Massachusetts is expanding several Medicare Savings Program (also known as "MassHealth Buy-in programs). These programs help older residents and people living with disabilities save money on their Medicare coverage,

If you are a Massachusetts resident with limited income and assets you may qualify for a Medicare Savings Program that will pay your monthly Part B premium, which is currently deducted from your Social Security benefit. In certain cases, a Medicare Savings Program may also pay your out-of-pocket Medicare Part A and B costs and your Part A premium (if you have one).

Starting January 1, 2020 the income and asset limits for the Medicare Savings Plan are increasing meaning more people will be able to get help paying for their Medicare.

If you qualify for a Medicare Savings Program, you will automatically qualify for Extra Help, a program that will help pay for your prescription drugs under Medicare.


