If you are enrolled in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO/ PPO), you should have received an information packet from your plan at the end of September. It's important to understand and save this information; it explains the changes in your plan for 2020.

Premiums, deductibles, co-pays, and the drugs covered by your plan can change significantly! During Medicare Open Enrollment, you can adjust your plan for next year.



Cranberry Stuffing

2 large onions, chopped (2 cups)

3 medium stalks celery, chopped

3 to 3 1/2 cups Progresso chicken broth (32 oz carton)

1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage or 1 teaspoon rubbed sage soned bread cubes for stuffing

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon pepper

1/2 cup sweetened dried cranberries

1 bag (12 oz) unsea-



- 1.) Heat oven to 350°F. Spray 13x9 Inch (3-quart) glass baking dish with cooking spray.
- 2.) In 10-inch nonstick skillet, cook onions and celery over medium-high heat 6 to 8 minutes, stirring occasionally, until onions are golden and tender. Add 3 cups of the broth, the sage, salt and pepper. Heat to boiling. Remove from heat.
- 3.) In large bowl, toss cranberries and bread cubes. Stir in onion mixture, tossing to evenly coat bread cubes. If desired, add up to 1/2 cup additional broth for a moister dressing.
- 4.) Spoon dressing into baking dish. Cover with foil. Bake 15 minutes; stir. Recover; bake 20 to 25 minutes longer or until hot in center (165°F).



Cold Weather Safety!

If you are like most people, you feel cold every now and then during the winter. What you may not know is that just being really cold can make you very sick. Older adults can loose body heat fast - faster than when they were young. Changes in your body that come with aging can make it harder for you to be aware of getting cold. A big chill can turn into a dangerous problem before an older person even knows what's happening. Doctor's call this hypothermia.

What is hypothermia? Hypothermia is what happens when your body temperature gets very low. For an older person, a body temperature of 95°F or lower can cause many health problems, such as a heart attack, kidney problems, liver damage or worse. Being outside in the cold, or even being in a very cold house, can lead to hypothermia. Try to stay away from cold places, and pay attention to how cold it is where you are. You can take steps to lower your chance of getting hypothermia.

Keep warm inside! Living in a cold house, apartment, or other building can cause hypothermia. People who are sick may have special problems keeping warm. Do not let it get too cold inside and dress warmly. Even if you keep your temperature between 60°F and 65°F, your home or apartment may not be warm enough to keep you safe.

Here are some tips for keeping warm while you're inside:

- Set up your heat to at least 68-70°F. To save on heating bills, close off rooms you are not using. Close the vents and shut the doors in these rooms, and keep the basement door closed.
 Place a rolled towel in front of all doors to keep out drafts.
- Make sure your house isn't losing heat through windows. Keep your blinds and curtains closed. If you have gaps around the windows, try using weather stripping or caulk to keep the cold air out.

- Dress warmly on cold days even if you are staying in the house.
 Throw a blanket over your legs. Wear socks and slippers.
- Make sure you eat enough food to keep up your weight. If you don't eat well, you might have less fat under your skin. Body fat helps you to stay warm.
- Drink alcohol moderately, if at all. Alcoholic drinks can make you lose body heat.
- Ask family and friends to check on you during cold weather. If a power outage leaves you without heat, try to stay with a relative or friend.


Snowstorms & Extreme Cold

Winter storms create a higher risk of car accidents, hypothermia, frostbite, carbon monoxide poisoning, and heart attacks from overexertion. Winter storms and blizzards can bring extreme cold, freezing rain, snow, ice and high winds.

If you are under a winter storm warning, find shelter right away.

- Stay off the road
- Stay indoors and dress warmly
- Prepare for power outages
- Listen for emergency information and alerts
- Look for signs of hypothermia and frostbite
- Check on neighbors
- Prepare your home to keep out the cold with insulation, caulking, and weather stripping. Learn how to keep pipes from freezing. Install and test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups.
- Sign up for your community warning system.
- Gather supplies in case you need to stay home for several days without power. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including your medication.

The words were barely out of his mouth when poof,


