Voting!

We have the option of voting in person or by mail. We hope that voting by mail will reduce lines on election day. To request a mail in ballot for the November election you should visit https://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele/elepdf/2020-Vote-by-Mail-Application.pdf before October 24th. In-person voting for the State Election is November 3rd. Early voting will take place over 14 days (10/17 - 10/30.)

COA Happenings:

Due to the high interest in classes, we anticipate that classes will fill quickly. If you are seriously interested in a class, we suggest you call the COA as soon as possible. No later than noon on the day before the class. No walk-ins allowed! If you have signed up for a class and you do not show up, you will be responsible for the cost. Please call us by noon on the day before the class to cancel. All equipment used during classes will be sanitized after each use. Our building is CLOSED but the bathrooms will be available with a pass and will be sanitized after each use.

Medicare Open Enrollment October 15th - December 7th

Need assistance with Medicare? Shine can help! This is your opportunity to review your Medicare plans with a Shine counselor to see what you can expect with your current plan in 2021, or to see if there is another plan that may be more cost-effective for you. Your health insurance costs are an important part of your budget, and Shine is available all year to help you review your plans and costs.

Beginning October 1st, NEET (Northern Essex Elder NEET Transportation) will resume rides with new mandated precautions. Everyone must pre-register. One

Social Security Phone Scam with a Twist

The Inspector General is warning seniors that scammers are not only calling and pretending to be governments employees...threatening legal action and demanding money or gift cards!! They are now sending fake documents by email to convince you to do what they ask...some documents even look like official Social Security letterhead!

- Social Security does not send official reports by email
- Social Security will never threaten you with arrest or other legal action over a fine or fee
- Social Security will never ask for payment by gift card, cash, or wire transfer

The Social Security Administration will send you a letter by MAIL if there is an issue with your Social Security account. If you get such a call, hang up or call the police, or Senior Medicare Patrol @ 1-800-243-4636.


