1 lb Lean Ground Beef 1/3 cup Bread Crumbs 2 teaspoon Ketchup 1 teaspoon Mustard 1 teaspoon Worcestershire 1/2 teaspoon Garlic Powder

1/2 teaspoon Onion Powder

1 tablespoon Olive Oil

1.) Combine all patty ingredients in a large bowl and massage with your hands until ingredients are incorporated.

- 2.) Heat 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat.

- 4.) Lower temperature to low.
- 5.) Whisk together gravy mix and water until well blended.
- 6.) Whisk in ketchup and Worcestershire and poor over patties in skillet.

People 65 Years and Older & Influenza

It has been recognized for many years that people 65 and older are at greater risk of serious complications from the flu compared with young, healthy adults because human immune defenses become weaker with age. While flu season can vary in severity, during most seasons, people 65 years and older bear the greatest burden of severe flu disease. In recent years, it's estimated that between 70 to 90 percent of seasonal flu-related deaths have occurred in people 65 and older and between 50 to 70 percent of seasonal flu-related hospitalizations have occurred among people in that age group. So, influenza is often quite serious for people 65 and older. The best way to protect against flu and its potentially serious complications, is that CDC recommends that everyone 65 and older get a seasonal flu vaccine each year by the end of October. However, as long as flu viruses are circulating, vaccination should continue throughout flu season, even in January or later. Older people with weaker immune systems often have a lower protective immune response after flu vaccination compared to younger, healthier people. This can make them more susceptible to the flu. Although immune responses may be lower in the elderly, vaccine effectiveness has been similar in most flu seasons among older adults and those with chronic health conditions compared to younger, healthy adults. People 65 and older should get a flu shot not a nasal spray vaccine. They can get any flu vaccine approved for use in that age group with no preference for any one vaccine over another. There are regular flu shots that are approved for use in people 65 and older and there also are two vaccines designed specifically for people 65 or older.

What are the emergency signs of flu?

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Persistent dizziness, confusion, inability to arouse
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen
- Seizure
- Not urinating
- Severe muscle pain
- Severe weakness or unsteadiness
- Fever or cough that improve but then return or worsen
- Worsening of chronic medical conditions

Consult your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning.

Blood Pressure!

More than 100 million U.S. adults have high blood pressure, according to the new statistics from the American Heart Assoc. Many people with high blood pressure aren't aware that they have it, and even in those cases that they are aware, their condition isn't well controlled. You are considered to have hypertension if you have blood pressure of at least 130 for the systolic [top] number or 80 for the diastolic [bottom] number. Experts note there is a solid scientific basis and a real need for the lower thresholds: if all American adults over age 45 were able to keep their blood pressure below the new standard of 130/80, it would prevent 3 million strokes and heart attacks over the next decade. Risk factors include: health condition, your lifestyle, and your family history which can increase your risk for high blood pressure. Some of the risk factors for high blood pressure cannot be controlled, but you can take steps to lower your risk by changing the factors you can control. Learn more about high blood pressure risk factors: **Conditions:**

- **Prehypertension:** is blood pressure that is slightly higher than normal.
- **Diabetes:** causes sugars to build up in the blood. About 60% of people with diabetes also have high blood pressure. **Behaviors:**
- **Unhealthy Diet:** A diet that is high in sodium and too low in potassium puts you at a high risk.
- Physical Inactivity: Not getting enough physical activity can make you gain weight.
- Obesity: Is excess body fat that is linked to higher "bad" cholesterol and triglyceride levels and to lower the "good" cholesterol levels. In addition to high blood pressure, obesity can also lead to heart attack.

Family History:

• **Family:** Family members share genes, behaviors, lifestyles and environments that can influence their health and their risk for disease. High blood pressure can run in the family.


