Medicare Open Enrollment October 15th thru December 7th

It's that time of year again! If you are enrolled in a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO/PPO), you should have received an information packet from your plan at the end of September. It's important to understand and save this information; it explains the changes in your plan for 2023. Premiums, deductibles, co-pays, and the drugs covered by your plan can change significantly! During Medicare Open Enrollment, you can adjust your plan for next year. SHINE Counselors can help you understand your plan changes as well as other options you may have. Our SHINE Representative is available on 11/17, 11/23, 12/1. During this period - her calendar fills up quickly so don't wait until the last minute to make an appointment. Some questions can be answered over the phone or via email but then there are the other questions which are more difficult and might require more than one meeting. **DON'T DELAY** in making your appointment. 




