Medicare Open Enrollment October 15th thru December 7th

It's that time of year again! Your health insurance needs are as unique as you. Because Medicare plans change every year, Medicare Open Enrollment period is the annual opportunity to review your Medicare insurance plan to ensure it is the most cost-effective plan for YOU. Each year plans can change in many ways, such as the list of medications that are covered on the plan. prescription co-pays, preferred pharmacies, provider networks, and other benefit co-pays. A certified SHINE counselor can assist you with understanding the various plan options for 2023. SHINE counselors provide individual-based, unbiased assistance to Medicare beneficiaries and their families about all Medicare options. By reviewing your coverage during Open Enrollment, you may find that your plan will still be most cost-effective for next year, or you may find a plan that helps to put money back in your pocket where it belongs! Our SHINE Representative is available on 11/3, 11/10. 11/17, 11/23, 12/1. During this period - her calendar fills up quickly so don't wait until the last minute to make an appointment. Some questions can be answered over the phone or via email but then there are the other questions which are more difficult and might require more than one meeting. 
