



### Mr. Provenmire,

- 1. The landing area will be about 700 feet from Ipswich Road so by the time the log trucks and chip trailers get to the road from the landing, most dirt/mud that may be on the wheels will have been knocked off. But Ipswich Road will be broomed off on a daily basis if necessary. If some stone is needed where the private road meets the public road, then the operator will put some there.
- 2. SC-2 will be covered with a metal plate or a temporary bridge to avoid any significant impacts to the stream and to protect the culvert. That will be added to the Forest Cutting Plan.
- 3. Harvesting can occur at any time of the year. Operators are usually given one year contracts because they need to schedule their work to keep their iron moving. The landowner and I will reserve the right to shut down the operation if adverse weather conditions cause any significant rutting or any unnecessary damage to the residual forest stand.
- 4. No stone walls along scenic roads will be disturbed. I did mark some timber near Main Street and have complied with the Ch.132 buffer strip requirement along a public way <a href="https://www.mass.gov/files/documents/2016/08/rk/ma-forestry-bmp-manual-rd.pdf">https://www.mass.gov/files/documents/2016/08/rk/ma-forestry-bmp-manual-rd.pdf</a> top of page 13: Buffer strips will extend 50 feet back from publicly maintained ways, except for town designated scenic roads, where they will extend 100 feet from the highway. I forgot to put the buffer strip on the map I'll fix that when I see Laura.

Hello Mr. Leonard,

I have received today your Forest Cutting Plan for 494 Ipswich Road. I offer the following comments.

• It appears from your plan that the harvested timber will be transported within the site to a landing area located at the southern end of the existing field, where I presume logs will be loaded onto trucks for transport over

public roadways. The Boxford ConsCom in the past has typically requested a stone "rumble strip" between a landing area and public roadways in order minimize mud tracked onto the road. Please confirm whether you will provide such a rumble strip.

- There is "stoned culvert farm crossing" at the base of a steep hill over which all harvested timber must be dragged/carried to reach the landing area. Please identify any protective measures you will employ to minimize the possibility of impacts to the stream at this sensitive point.
- There does not appear to be any limitation on the Forest Cutting Plan regarding time of year for the harvest. Impacts from erosion on steep slopes can presumably be minimized by conducting harvesting operations during periods when the ground is frozen. Please indicate when harvesting operations are planned to occur.
- Please be aware that Boxford has designated all local roads as "Scenic Roads" subject to protection. Disturbance of stone walls or trees within a Scenic Roadway requires a permit from the Planning Board. Please confirm that no such disturbance is contemplated in your plan.
