Section 3.1 – Project Request

Grant Type: Project

Amount Requested: \$75,000

Grant Scope: The Town-owned Stiles Pond Beach provides an opportunity for residents to enjoy the summertime at beautiful Stiles Pond at a very low cost. One of the major benefits of Stiles Pond is the child-friendly swimming area, which allows beachgoers and their children to cool off on a hot summer day.

Currently, the beach has three docks: two "I" shaped docks adjacent to the shoreline and one small, square floating dock at the edge of the swimming area. I've included a picture of one of the existing "I" docks in the supporting documents, for reference. Not only are these docks beyond their useful life, they are not ADA-compliant. There are no railings or bump-outs and the existing ramp is not of sufficient quality to allow for easy access to the docks for adults and children that use wheelchairs or have other mobility-related disabilities.

In order to remedy the situation and ensure that the docks and swimming area of Stiles Pond Beach are accessible to everyone, the Town is proposing to utilize this grant funding to replace the existing docks and install new ADA-compliant docks, consistent with the diagrams submitted in the supporting documents. The ADA-compliant feature of the new docks, which do not currently exist at the docks at Stiles Pond Beach now, are:

- Railings, which allow for use of the docks by those that use wheelchairs or deal with mobility impairments;
- A 10-foot ramp at the entrance to each dock to allow for easy access to the docks for those that use wheelchairs or deal with mobility impairments;
- Swim ladders to ensure access to the water for those that use wheelchairs or deal with mobility impairments;
- ADA curbing around the new, square floating dock to allow for use of the floating dock by those that use wheelchairs or deal with mobility impairments.

Cost Estimate: The total project cost estimate is \$75,000, as outlined in the attached quote from EZ Dock Northeast (including an additional \$1,500 above the quote as a contingency).

Project Timeline: If we are granted funding in December 2023, the Town would immediately issue a request for proposals (RFP) using the competitive sealed proposal process outlined in M.G.L. c. 30B. It is anticipated that the vendor with the most advantageous proposal would be selected before the end of January 2024. At that time, an installation schedule will be established with the selected vendor for sometime in either April or May 2024. Based on my conversations with an EZ Dock Northeast representative, installation should only take one day, meaning that it will be completed prior to the opening of the Stiles Pond Beach for the 2024 season in June.

Proposed Use: The Stiles Pond Beach is an affordable resource to Boxford residents seeking to enjoy the pond's natural beauty in the hot summer months. Currently, the docks Town-owned beach are not ADA-compliant and cannot be sufficiently utilized by residents with mobility issues, so this project would

allow those with mobility issues to fully enjoy the beach and swimming area and use the docks during their time at the beach.

Staffing and Maintenance Plan: No alterations to the beach's current staffing model and operations would be required. Installation and maintenance are expected to be handled by the dock vendor.

Renovation and Construction History: The current docks were installed sometime around the year 2000.

Additional Funding Sources: The Town has not allocated additional funding for this project. However, the Boxford Athletic Association (BAA), which manages the beach, has some reserve funding available, though such funding is utilized to supplement the beach's operating expenses and keep membership fees affordable for residents.

Section 3.2 – Impact Information

Impact on People: Anywhere from 250 – 400 Boxford families are members of the Stiles Pond Beach each summer, and a countless number of the Town's roughly 8,500 residents utilize the beautiful beach each season.

Impact on Access: Of those 250 - 400 families that join the Stiles Pond Beach each summer, many have dependents with disabilities that are unable to fully enjoy the Stiles Pond Beach swimming area and docks, or they have disabilities themselves. This means that they cannot fully enjoy the amenities that Stiles Pond Beach has to offer, and many avoid the beach altogether because of this. Installing ADA-compliant docks will remedy the barriers to access for those with mobility issues so that they can fully enjoy Stiles Pond Beach, the swimming area, and the docks.

Monthly Usage: The beach is open from June until early September (Labor Day). Usage during those months is high, especially on the weekends, by the 250-400 families that sign up for memberships.

Census Data: In 2021, the US Census Bureau estimated that 4.7% of the Town's population under the age of 65 years old has a disability.
