Happy New Year from the Boxford Elementary Schools!

2022-2023 Kindergarten Registration is now open. All students are required to be five years of age on or before September 1st, 2022 to enroll in kindergarten. There you will find a welcome letter which details all the necessary documentation with links to each of the forms. The earlier that families can register the better as it helps with planning for the next school year. Road, Boxford, MA 01921. Registration documents should be received by Friday January 28, 2022. Current eligible preschool students do not need to register.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS



The DPW has transitioned into winter operations. Over the Christmas holiday weekend, the staff did a great job managing a difficult ice and snow event, spending much of their own holiday on the roads treating for icy

conditions and plowing. Sometimes overlooked as frontline or essential workers, we were reminded just how dedicated and dependable our DPW workers remain, even during the most challenging times. Thank you, Boxford DPW Staff.

For 2022, DPW is concentrating on exploring grant opportunities and making progress on various future projects for the new year and beyond. This includes investigating potential projects for FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program for building resiliency within our culvert and drainage systems. Further, we continue to work on the backlog of projects caused by COVID and are hopeful that the 2022 construction season allows us to complete some important work that was suspended or delayed during the pandemic. This includes but is not limited to: the culvert replacement on Willow Rd, improvements to the Rail Trail off of Pye Brook Ln, the design and permitting of several

other culverts identified in the town-wide inventory, resuming design on the Rte. 133 TIP project, and resuming design and permitting of the DPW Auxiliary Fabric Building.

BOXFORD POLICE



The Boxford Police Department wishes you a Happy New Year and a reminder that the winter storm season is upon us. Boxford does have an overnight parking ban on public roads from December 1st through April 1st.

Keeping your vehicles off the street is a great help to the Department of Public Works while plowing and sanding.

If you hire a plow contractor for snow removal, please request the contractor not plow across roadways. This can create snow windrows that are dangerous to the traveling public and hamper snow removal. Remember to clean all snow and ice off of your vehicle, including the roof and remember to defrost windows well prior to operating the vehicle. Following these guidelines will keep all of us safe when on Boxford roads during the winter.

BOXFORD FIRE DEPARTMENT

The 2022 Burn Season begins January 15th and runs through May 1st. Permits are \$20.00 and can be purchased online through the <u>Fire Department webpage</u> on the Town Website. Fires cannot start before 10:00am and must be extinguished by 4:00pm. While your permit is good for the entire season, a daily activation is required to burn on any particular day.

Remember that open burning is for yard cleanup. Please do not burn trash, construction or other manufactured materials. All fires must be attended with a means to extinguish your fire readily available.

Never use gasoline or other flammable liquids to start your fire. Instead, use dry kindling with paper. Old Christmas trees are another good source but will burn very quickly and hot. You should wear long sleeves for protection from embers. Additional information is available on the Town's <u>website</u>.

Finally, weather conditions can change quickly causing fires to spread. Manage the size of your fire and be willing to extinguish early if the weather changes. Do not wait to call 911 if you need help. Last year we responded to 12 brush fires with one consuming 8 acres, as seen in the photo.

As we are entering winter storm season the Boxford Communications Department would like to remind residents of what to do if your electricity goes off.

If your electricity goes off, please notify National Grid at 1-800-465-1212.

- You will be connected with an automated system which will immediately alert National Grid as to your outage.
- If multiple residents in your area call it will immediately alert National Grid to a more widespread outage.
- It is very important that ALL residents experiencing an outage call National Grid immediately when an outage occurs so that prompt repair of the problem can begin.
- Please do not call the Police or Fire Departments to report an outage unless you have an emergency.
- If you do have an emergency please call 911.

CONSERVATION, PLANNING, CPC


The Conservation Commission welcomed two new members in late fall of 2021, Doug Hamilton and Greg Kokorda, and gave a fond farewell to longtime members Peter Delaney and Mark Mitsch. The Conservation Commission members were busy in recent months wrapping up the review and approval of the Willows at Boxford elderly housing project and the proposed new parking areas for the Cole and Spofford Pond Schools.

The Planning Board carefully reviewed the Cole and Spofford Pond School projects for scale and design. Comments from the Board resulted in modifications to the parking lot design for Cole School to include a greater separation from Middleton Road and enhanced plantings.

The Community Preservation Committee (CPC) is looking forward to receiving new applications for funding by the February 4, 2022 deadline. These applications will be considered for funding at the Annual Town Meeting in May, 2022. TREASURER/TAX COLLECTOR

Real estate and personal property tax bills for FY 2022 were mailed on 12/30/21. The remaining tax due for the fiscal year is calculated by multiplying the new property valuation by the tax rate of \$15.22/M and subtracting estimated payments made on Aug. 1st and Nov. 1st. The balance is due in equal installments on Feb. 1st and May 2^{std}. Please contact the office at 978-887-3674 if you did not receive a bill. Payments may be conveniently made online through the <u>town website</u>.

Motor vehicle excise tax bills for 2022 for all vehicles garaged in Boxford and registered as of Jan. 1st will be mailed in late February and due within 30 days.

Construction of the Center at 10 Elm continues to progress. When completed this fall, it will be the new home of the Boxford Council on Aging and a new community space for all residents to enjoy. Residents will notice that the former library wing has been demolished and we can now see the beginnings of the new wing of the center. The foundation and concrete slab for the wing was poured over the last several weeks. Framing will begin later in January. A Lot of attention and care has been taken throughout the historic renovation of the Cummings House, including shoring up the foundation and roof rafters. Residents can track the progress of construction on the **project page** of the town website.

The COA is excited to be able to expand their square footage and their offerings when the Center at 10 Elm opens. ASSESSOR

The Assessing department has completed the Fiscal Year 2022 Interim Revaluation of all assessed property values. FY22 assessments were derived through an analysis of qualified property sales that occurred in calendar year 2020. The total assessed valuation of taxable property in town has increased by approximately 8%, but changes will vary for individual properties depending on factors such as style and condition of property.

The Fiscal Year 2022 tax rate has been set at \$15.22 per thousand of assessed value, which is a rate decrease of five percent over last year.

The new tax rate and property values are reflected on the bills that were mailed out on December 31, 2021. This bill contained two remittance forms, one for the payment due on February 1^{st} and one for the payment due on May 2^{sd} .

Property values for all parcels in town are available on the town's website. Residents who have questions regarding their property value are encouraged to contact the Assessors' office at 978-887-6692 before February 1, 2022.

The period for filing Real Estate Tax Exemptions for residents who are eligible for property tax relief is currently ongoing. Some of the programs available include:

- Legally Blind
- D' 11 1W
- Disabled Veterans
- Seniors 65 years +, with low to moderate income
- CPA Surcharge Exemption

Anyone interested in applying for an exemption should contact the Assessors Office at (978) 887-6692, Monday – Thursday 8:00am to 4:30pm. Applications will be accepted until April 1, 2022 for the current tax year.

PUBLIC REVIEW PERIOD OPEN FOR BOXFORD COMMUNITY ELECTRICITY

The Town of Boxford has released a draft plan for the Boxford Community Electricity program and the plan is available for public review and comment. Boxford Community Electricity will seek to provide more electricity options and more renewable energy for residents and businesses in Boxford. The Plan describes how the electricity program will be structured and operated, and the Plan is available at <u>boxfordelectricity.com</u>, Town Hall, and the library.

Boxford Community Electricity will provide multiple options for electricity supply, with different amounts of renewable energy so everyone can find the right balance between their budget and renewable energy. The program will not change our electric utility - National Grid will continue to deliver electricity, maintain poles and wires and respond to power outages. If you participate in Boxford Community Electricity, only the "Supply Services" portion of your National Grid bill will change (see sample bill here).

The development of the Boxford Community Electricity Program started with the passing of an authorizing resolution at the 2020 Spring Town Meeting. The Town of Boxford then ran a competitive process to select an experienced energy consultant that would assist with program development and implementation. The Town selected Good Energy, L.P., and Good Energy has been working with Town staff and the Boxford Sustainability Committee in developing the program plan. Patrick Roche from Good Energy presented a brief overview of the program at the Select Board meeting on December 8, 2021. A recording of the presentation can be found on the Boxford Cable Access TV (direct link here). At the meeting, the Select Board opened a public review process which will continue until the January 18, 2022, Select Board meeting. The public is invited to submit comments about the Program Plan on the program website **boxfordelectricity.com** or in writing to Town Administrator, 7A Spofford Road, Boxford, MA 01921. Verbal comments can also be submitted during the Public Hearing which will be held on January 18, 2022.

Following the public review and hearing, the Select Board will vote on whether to approve the Plan and submit it to the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities (DPU). After review and approval by the DPU, the Town will be able to launch the Program.
